## Newsletter October 2016

This summer, amidst the rugged beauty of mountainous rural Spain, I was again reminded of one of the many things we so easily take for granted. Late one evening after a powerful storm we experienced a complete power cut. Darkness can be both a wonderful and equally frightening thing. Few places, of course, are truly dark, although with no stars and no other nearby properties, the brooding darkness was remarkable... Thank goodness for emergency torches!

It's amazing how light transforms a place and can bring comfort and security - we so often take that light in our homes and communities for granted. Back in October 1879, Thomas Edison successfully tested an electric incandescent lamp with a carbonized filament at his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey, keeping it lit for over 13 hours... and the rest, as they say, is history.

But as well as physical darkness, there is also an emotional darkness that can envelope people, a locality or a community. You only have to watch the news, or visit war-torn, poverty-stricken areas to experience that kind of desolation. Recent images from Syria bring this truth all too painfully to mind.

My cousins are American and live in Virginia where there's a place in the south - not listed in the travel brochures - which is basically many hundreds of square miles of nothing. A highway map of the state simply shows it as a series of little squiggly symbols, and its name: "The Great Dismal Swamp"! The Great Dismal Swamp: acres and acres of wetland and water, part waste, all wild; much of it ugly, most of it useless.

Who could fall in love with anything like that? Why would anyone ever want anything to do with such a dark, barren and worthless land? Which causes me to pause and think and remember again those words from Genesis chapter 1: *"the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while the Spirit of God brooded over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. And God saw that the light was good."*

As summer turns to autumn, with evening light beginning to fade and with seemingly endless darkness daily before us in the news, may you remember Jesus, hope of the nations and be encouraged. *"For the Light shines out in the darkness and the darkness can never put it out."*
